On 5 different occasions Jesus prophesied that He would be crucified, buried, and on the third day rise from the dead (Matt.12:39-40; 20:17-19; 26:30-32; Luke 18:31-33; John 2:19-22).

Jesus knew His mission was to die for humanity. It was Christ's supreme work on earth. God's purpose could be accomplished in no other way.

1. It Fulfills the Promise To Crush the Serpent

"So the LORD God said to the serpent... I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel." (Genesis 3:14-15) God is talking to Satan. He is saying that Jesus will "crush Satan's head" (at the cross) and that Satan "will strike Christ's heel" (at the cross).

3. It Triumphs Over Satan as Tempter

- 1 John 3:8 "The one who commits sin is of the Devil, for the Devil has sinned from the beginning. The Son of God was revealed for this purpose: to destroy the Devil's works."
- Root word: To loose. Weymouth: "for the purpose of undoing the work of the Devil". To break his power, once and for all.

3. It Triumphs Over Satan as Tempter

• The work of the devil is to tempt people to sin. When they sin his work is accomplished. So what the Son of God came to destroy is not just the guilt of sin but actually sinning. The Son of God came to destroy sinning.

- John Piper -

Hebrews 2:14-15 "Now since the children have flesh and blood in common, He also shared in these, so that through His death He might destroy the one holding the power of death — that is, the Devil— and free those who were held in slavery all their lives by the fear of death."

The Only Lethal Weapon the Devil Has (1)

 Now how does that render powerless the one who had the power of death, the devil? It doesn't mean Christians don't die a physical death – sometimes very painful ones. Nor does it mean that Satan can't kill us (see Revelation 2:10). What it means is that the only weapon the devil can use to destroy us in death is our sin.

 Nobody goes to hell because they are oppressed by the devil or even possessed by the devil... The only reason anybody goes to hell is because of their own sin.

The Only Lethal Weapon the Devil Has (2)

 All Satan can do is fight like hell to keep you sinning and to keep you away from the one who forgives sin... Because if your sin is forgiven, and the wrath of God Almighty is turned away from you, then the devil is disarmed. – John Piper -

- To render inactivate, inoperative.
- NAS95: "render powerless"

- "To expose to public infamy"—Vincent's Word Studies in the N.T.

- When a Roman general had won a really notable victory, he was allowed to march his victorious armies through the streets of Rome and behind him followed the kings and the leaders and the peoples he had vanquished. They were openly branded as his spoils.
- Paul thinks of Jesus as a conqueror enjoying a kind of cosmic triumph, and in his triumphal procession are the powers of evil, beaten for ever, for every one to see.
